

INDIAN LAKES FOUNDATION POOL RULES

OPERATING RULES AND REGULATIONS

The following rules and regulations have been established for the benefit and protection of all users of the Indian Lakes Pool to assure safe and sanitary operation of pool facilities and to provide enjoyable recreation for all residents and their guests. Residents are requested to cooperate in observing rules, and to obey the instructions of the property manager, pool manager, lifeguards and other pool attendants.

SECTION I - ENFORCEMENT OF THE RULES

The Pool Management Firm and lifeguards on duty are responsible for the safe and orderly operation of the pool. All persons shall obey the instructions of the lifeguards. No person shall use the pool unless it is officially open, and the lifeguards are on duty. The lifeguards on duty have authority over all persons in the pool area. Failure to comply with these rules or the lifeguard's instructions will result in expulsion from the pool area, and loss of pool privileges for such period of time as determined by the Foundation Manager or the Board of Directors. Comments or complaints about the operation of the pool should be referred to the Foundation Manager, or the Board of Directors.

SECTION II - IDENTIFICATION

1. Only residents whose dues are current will be eligible to use the pool.
2. Access to the pool area is through the use of Activity Tags which that may be obtained by new residents through the Homeowners' Association Office at the prescribed times. The cost for the activity tags is \$6.00 each.
3. The Activity Tag that which is assigned to you is required to be worn at all times in the pool area.
4. Activity Tags will be issued to all members of the immediate family nine years of age and older. Immediate family members are defined as father, mother, and single children, also grandparents permanently residing with and dependent upon the homeowner.
5. Activity tags are for individual use and are **NOT** transferable to friends or relatives. Such transfer of Activity Tags will result in suspension of recreation privileges.
6. Lost activity tags can be replaced only at the office for a fee of \$10.00. Report lost Activity Tags to the Homeowners' Association Office Immediately.

SECTION IV - GUESTS

1. A **SEASON GUEST PASS** for Indian Lakes Foundation residents is defined as a homeowner's visiting relatives or friends, whose permanent principal legal resident is **OUTSIDE THE RESIDENT'S ADDRESS**. Admittance to the recreation area for season guests may be obtained as follows: to receive a **SEASON GUEST PASS** allowing full pool privileges, the host homeowner must fill out the pass for each person at the office. It will cost \$40.00 per person. **SEASON GUEST PASS** available at the office ONLY.

For outside non-residents there is now a **SEASON GUEST PASS** for a cost of \$50.00 per person.

2. A **MONTHLY GUEST PASS** for Indian Lakes Foundation residents is defined as a homeowner's visiting relatives or friends whose permanent principal legal resident is **OUTSIDE THE RESIDENT'S ADDRESS**. Admittance to the recreation area for monthly guests may be obtained as follows: to receive a **MONTHLY GUEST PASS** allowing full pool privileges, the host homeowner must fill out the pass for each person at the office. It will cost \$15.00 per person. **MONTHLY GUEST PASSES** available at the office ONLY.

3. A **DAILY GUEST PASS** is defined as any individual not residing in the home of a homeowner for more than 24 hours. The cost is \$7.00 per day, per person for anyone five years of age and older. The **HOMEOWNER** must sign the Guest pass form. **DAILY PASS** available at the Pool. An exact amount must be presented.
5. Only **ADULTS OVER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN** may obtain guest passes.
6. Children **LESS THAN** 13 years of age will not be allowed to bring guests into the pool. Children between the ages of 13 and 17 will be allowed **ONE** guest per day providing other provisions of this Section are complied.
7. Each homeowner will be eligible to receive **TWO FREE WEEKLY GUEST PASSES** during each pool season. These will be issued only at the Homeowner's Office. Free guest passes will cover guests (maximum of six) listed for a maximum of one week.
8. Children of Adult Guests that are four years of age or under will be allowed to access the pool for free.

SECTION V - DIVING

1. **NO DIVING PERMITTED** (to avoid neck injury)!!!

SECTION VI - HEALTH

1. All persons using the pool must take a shower before entering the pool.
2. Admission shall be refused all persons having any infections, disease, sore or inflamed eyes, colds, nasal or ear discharges, or any communicable disease of any kind. Persons with excessive sunburn, open sores, poison ivy, and bandages of any kind will not be admitted.

SECTION VII - RULES APPLYING SPECIFICALLY TO CHILDREN

1. Children eight years of age and under must be accompanied by an adult (18 years of age or older) in the pool area **WHO SHALL REMAIN WITHIN EASY REACHING DISTANCE OF THE CHILD** (limited to (4) children per adult: children must be Indian Lakes residents to enter without a guest pass).
2. Babysitters (16 or 17 years of age) of children eight years of age and under must have written permission from both the child's parent and the babysitter's parent. A form for this purpose is available at the Homeowner's Association Office. Babysitters (16 or 17 years of age) are limited to (3) children under the age of nine.
3. All children 9-12 years of age must be able to pass the Swim Test, which will be administered by the lifeguards in order to use the pool without being accompanied by an adult. Children of this age group who have previously passed the test must be retested each season.

4. The last fifteen minutes before each hour, only adults (18) or older may swim. Adults will be permitted to have a child in the pool during this period, only in the shallow end, which is sectioned off by the safety line and floats, to work with the child in the water on a one to one basis. There will be no exceptions to this rule. During this rest period, all other children will be completely out of the pool and away from the sides.
5. Only children four years of age or younger may use the wading pool, and must be supervised at all times by the parent.
6. Children wearing only diapers will not be permitted in the pool. All diaper age children using either pool must wear snug fitting plastic or rubber pants over training pants or toddler swim pants - like Huggies "Little Swimmers." **NO DISPOSABLE DIAPERS WILL BE ALLOWED.**
7. Parents are responsible for cleaning up after their children. Examples: towels, shoes, snack wrappers, soda cans, etc.

SECTION VIII - GENERAL RULES

1. All persons using the pool do so at their own risk. The Foundation assumes no responsibility for any accident or injury in connection with such use or for any loss or damage to personal property.
2. Persons using the pool area agree not to hold the Foundation liable for any actions of whatever nature occurring within the pool area. Also, residents are responsible for the actions of their children and guests.
3. Persons must stay clear of guard stations, and not loiter at the check-in area.
4. Persons should not converse with the lifeguards while the guards are on duty unless assistance is needed.
5. The pool will be clear of all people in the event of any emergency. The signal for this will be **SEVERAL SHARP BLASTS ON THE GUARD'S WHISTLE.**
6. Hanging on the ropes is prohibited.
7. Toys (rubber rafts, inflatable toys, balls, frisbees, etc.) are not permitted in the pool. Plastic toys are permitted in the wading pool only. Water wings only are allowed at the discretion of the lifeguards. Life preservers can be used by disabled individuals only (with Management's permission)
8. Rubber eye goggles to protect an individual's eyes from the pool chemicals will be permitted as long as the transparent lens material is of plastic or of a similar nature. Goggles with glass lenses will not be permitted for safety reasons.
9. For the swimmer's safety, no objects, including gum or candy, may be in the mouth of a swimmer.

10. No running, pushing, dunking, rough play, or profane language will be permitted in the pool area. Standing or sitting on another's shoulders is not permitted.
11. No food, drink, or smoking is allowed beyond the pool retaining fence. Glass containers and breakable objects are not permitted in the pool area.
12. No alcoholic beverages or intoxicated persons will be allowed in the pool area during open pool hours.
13. No pets are permitted inside the pool area.
14. All refuse, including cigarette butts, will be placed in containers provided for this purpose.
15. Only swim wear will be allowed in the pool; cutoffs or other similar street clothes are not considered swim wear.
16. All patrons are expected to behave in an orderly fashion and conduct themselves in a decent and seemly manner.
